Role Purpose:	This role will support the development of new high-quality partnerships between ScoutsCymru and external organisations which will support both our Community Impact and 6-25 pillars of work and will manage our existing relationships with organisations such as RNLI & the Senedd.

Appointment Requirements	<p>The appointment is for an initial period of 3 years (subject to annual review with the Commissioner Wales – Programme), with the potential for re-appointment for a further period.</p> <p>This is a voluntary role and is unremunerated, however, reasonable expenses in line with the expenses policy will be paid.</p> <p>In common with all national appointments, the successful candidate will be assigned a training adviser and will be required to complete the role specific training.</p> <p>The applicant must become a member of The Scout Association including successful conclusion of our vetting process and making the promise.</p>

Time commitment: 12 meetings with the Programme Team each year
Termly meetings with Commissioner Wales – Programme to share progress and update
Any additional Team Cymru meetings and development days
Approximately 12 hours per month to commit to the role

Person Specification

Any member of the Scout Association currently aged over 18 is eligible to apply for this role. During the selection process you will be asked to demonstrate that:

- Be able to build a positive and active relationship with others
- Willingness to travel across the Wales (although much of the role can be undertaken remotely) and have the time necessary to undertake the role effectively.
- Have good written and oral communication skills
- Have excellent computer and digital skills
- Be able to work well in meetings
- Possess good presenting and facilitating skills
- Be articulate
- Confident public speaker
- Accept the policies and rules of The Scout Association
- This role holder does not need any previous experience of scouting and may be held by an associate member
